## Arriva Bus Service Update

In April 2022, Arriva Bus made a number of changes to the bus routes in Shrewsbury. For residents of Oteley Gardens, the no. 8 service on Sutton Rd (just opposite the site entrance) has been replaced by the 17/17a service.

The 17/17a runs between Shrewsbury Town Centre and Wellington and the Princess Royal Hospital via Sutton Rd. The bus will be hourly Mondays-Saturdays with journey times of around 15 minutes in to Shrewsbury town centre.

## Highway Code Changes

Great news everyone!

The highway code has been changed to encourage a safer environment for non-car users.

The change in priority means that if you are a motorist you need to be considerate of more vulnerable road users such as pedestrians, cyclists and horse riders. They aren't in an armoured metal box so are more likely to be seriously injured.

Remember, give cyclists more space when overtaking, look behind you when you open your car door by using your opposite hand and let people and bikes cross a road before you turn into a junction.

This will help everyone share the space fairly and equitably.
